Dear Owner:

This letter and the material attached to it contain very important information for you concerning the 1985 Food Security Act (FSA).

Based on information from a wetland inventory team and material you provided, determinations have now been completed. These areas are identified on the attached aerial photo, and the symbols are explained on the enclosed definition page.

If you do not agree with this determination, you can request that I reconsider my findings. You can do this by providing me a letter asking for reconsideration and supplying me information on any previous altering activity in the area. This needs to be done within 45 days of receiving this letter.

This determination covers only Food Security Act eligibility. Other federal regulations and/or permits governing use of wetlands may be required, including the need for Section 404 permits from the Corps of Engineers.

This notification is for wetlands only, as a Highly Erodible Land determination was sent previously.
